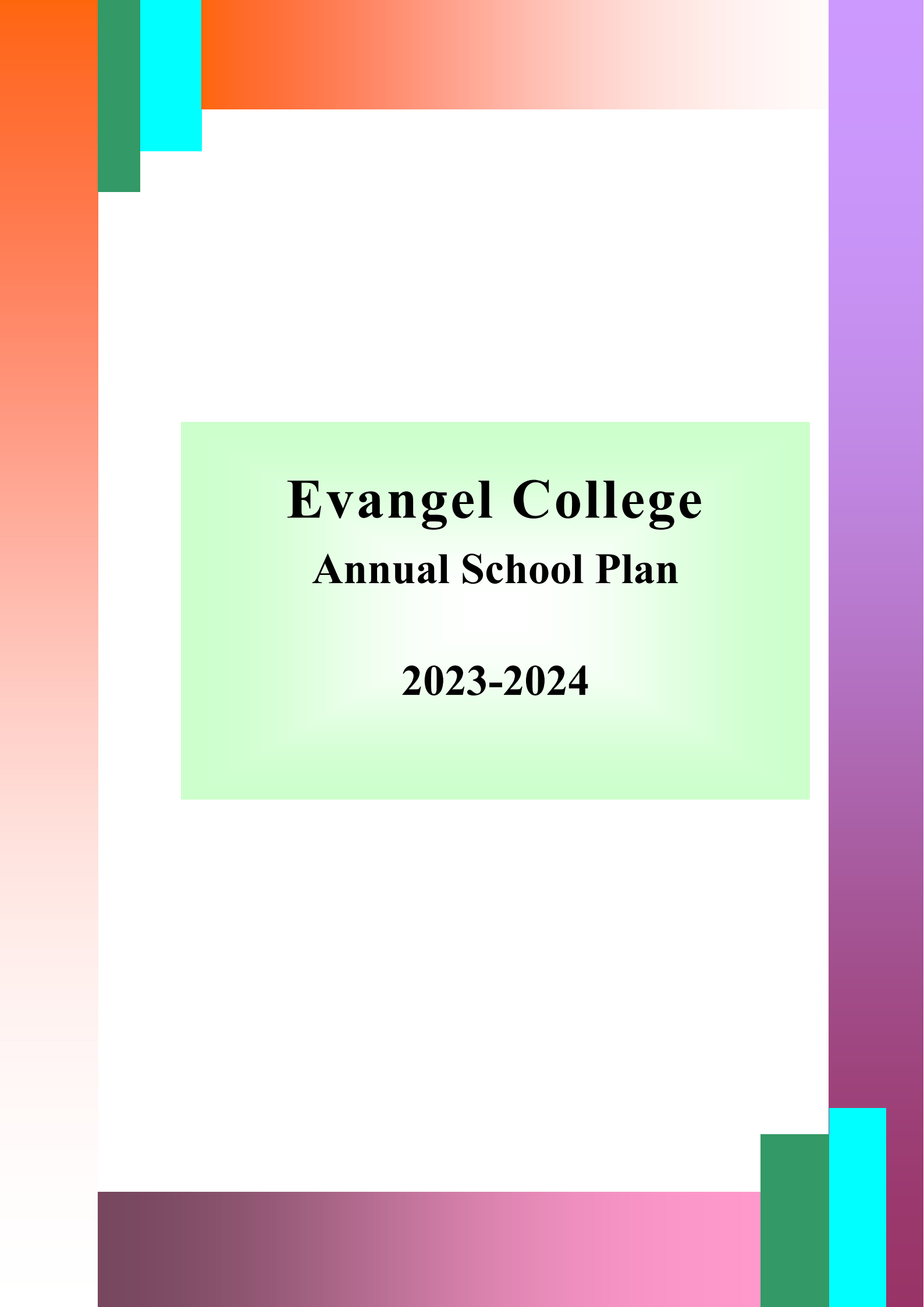

1.1 School Mission (put forward by the School Sponsoring Body)

With biblical truth as our cornerstone, we seek to provide quality whole-person education to help the youth cultivate a wholesome attitude, realize their potentials and achieve a well-balanced development, spiritually, morally, intellectually, physically, socially and aesthetically. We strive to guide the young towards a life based on Christian virtues, Chinese culture and a global outlook. In our school, the children will live together in harmony, mutual respects, but are fearless to face their responsibilities. They are driven by a desire to care about the community, serve mankind and not least, their country.

1.2 School Vision (put forward by the school)

To fulfill the school mission, we have to make every effort to build the capacity of teachers to learn, teach and excel in teaching. We seek to develop teachers to build a needs-satisfying school in which the needs of students (relationship, power, fun, freedom and survival) are satisfied, the self-worth of students is built, the self-concept of students is developed and the academic and non-academic potential of students are realized to fullness. We strive to implement Life Value Education which helps students to explore, acquire and apply values of Chinese culture and of Christian faith in the context of personal, social, societal, national and global domains.

This we endeavor to accomplish by having:

1. A Christian school environment where Christian values and principles are practised and teachers are committed to model such values and principles in all aspect of their work;
2. An inviting school environment where staff and students cooperate to make the school campus clean, safe (bully-free and sexual harassment-free) and student-friendly;
3. A loving and caring school environment where all students are treated with love and respect and guided to love and respect each other;
4. A nurturing school environment where all students are provided with adequate and diversified learning opportunities for developing self-worth, healthy self-concept and realizing their potential (academic and non-academic);
5. A student-centred classroom environment where all classes are motivated and engaged to excel in learning and “learning to learn” and where all teachers are committed to pursue collegial learning for conducting high quality school-based curriculum development, unit planning, instruction, assessment for learning, practices catering for diverse learning needs and nurture students into independent learners.
6. A cooperative and collaborative school environment open to all without partiality where all stakeholders of the school – students, teachers, principal, non-teaching staff, parents, school board, EDB, church, community and tertiary partners - work together in a spirit of solidarity and trust.
7. A thanksgiving and appreciation school environment where the effort, participation and achievement of all stakeholders of the school and the work of God are recognized, acknowledged and celebrated.

Key Concerns:

1. Supervise & support teachers to adopt the recommended strategies accurately to create breakthrough in academic performance at the high point of academic attainment.
2. Infuse life value education (Biblical values, Chinese cultural values, 10 priority values/attitudes of EDB) into whole person development.
3. Develop leaders to lead, manage & administer change by adopting recommended models of practice.

Briefly list the feedback and follow-up actions from the previous school year:

1. Academic Attainment

- MAM & Feedback Scheme, (2) BT, BT Portfolio & BT Mark Scheme have been initiated. This school year, the school should (1) help teachers master the underpinning principles more deeply; deepen and vary the practices to challenges students at different level of performance equally; support SALT by making good use of the above measures; (2) mine data to inform students about their progress e.g. Lexile scores, BT Mark, MAM, test scores, predicted grades, etc.; (3) improve the educational technologies, e.g. smartboards, apps, BYOD etc. and renew the school-based rubrics of teaching and learning accordingly to facilitate student-centred learning and teaching as well as foster the aforementioned measures.

2. Character Building

- The school has conceptualized the model of practice in Life Value Education – the VESSEL Approach. This year, the school should (1) deepen the current practices; (2) develop more value-based experiential learning; (3) better the ways to share students' practices; (4) develop the code of behavior geared with our values as well as the priority attitudes/values put forward by EDB; and (5) launch the implementation the ACTS Afternoon Program which fosters whole person development of primary students.

3. Teacher leadership

- The school has expanded the senior management team and set more platforms for lateral and horizontal communication. The year, the school should (1) create more time and space for teachers to communicate, collaborate and cope with new initiatives of EDB; (2) consolidate/develop models of teacher leadership; (3) learn to mine and use data to inform the school's planning, implementation and evaluation.
